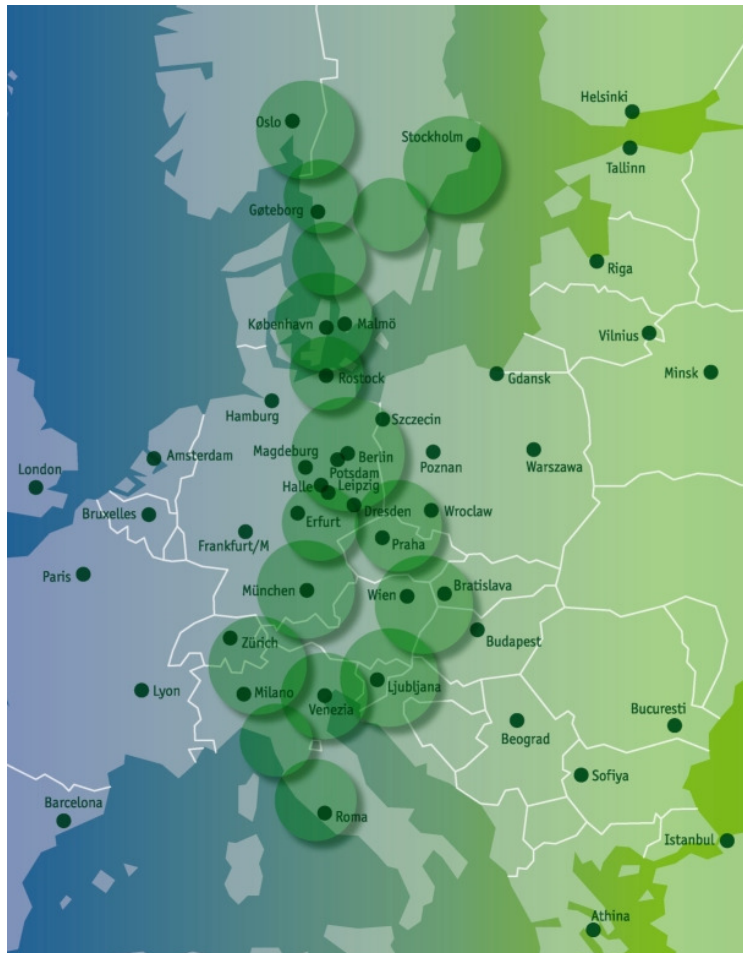


Scandria Berlin Declaration Scandinavian-Adriatic Corridor

The Declaration on the Development of Innovation and Growth along the Scandinavian Adriatic Corridor (Scandria Berlin Declaration) was set out by the Scandria project¹ in the framework of its international conference as of 16 September 2010 in Berlin. It updates and extends the COINCO Charter from 8 March 2007 and the Berlin Declaration from 30 November 2007.

The signing parties DECLARE their will to initiate a closer cooperation within the Scandria corridor from Oslo and Stockholm via Malmö and Copenhagen to Berlin and further to the Adriatic Sea in order to achieve more innovation and sustainable growth.

To achieve this, the signing parties in their respective responsibility

- **AIM** for a well balanced, coherent and sustainable development along the Scandinavian Adriatic Corridor based on the Corridor potentials and functionalities.
- **SUPPORT** effective and environmental friendly co-modal transport solutions in order to establish Scandria as a Green Corridor.
- **CONTRIBUTE ACTIVELY** to the Scandria Action Programme in order to improve the connection between Scandinavia and the Adriatic Sea via Berlin which is based on the pillars:
 - 1) Scandria Investment Strategy describing infrastructure needs
 - 2) Scandria Logistic Business Development Strategy
- **SUPPORT** the Scandria corridor jointly like in TEN-T policy, here extension of PP 1 + 22 via Berlin-Rostock-Oresund Region in order to connect with Nordic Triangle as part of the Core Net.
- **INITIATE** new cooperations (projects) in transport and economics.
- **AIM** for port cooperations in the Baltic and Adriatic Sea as well as across the landbridge.
- **CONTRIBUTE** to relevant EU strategies and policies such as the EU Baltic Sea Strategy, VASAB Long Term Strategy, EU 2020 and the EU cohesion policy (2014+).
- **WELCOME** the economic driven North-South-Initiative (www.north-south-initiative.eu).
- **SUPPORT** the idea of establishing a political platform 'economically thriving Central Europe' - bringing together local and regional authorities, economic and social partners.
